

# Residents forced out of SD home after landslide

SAN DIEGO — Four San Diego residents were homeless on New Year's Eve after a landslide threatened to crush their house.

A San Diego Fire-Rescue Department dispatcher said Saturday that rain-soaked soil began to slip down a 150-foot hill behind the home late Friday afternoon.

A city engineer and geologist were sent to the neighborhood near Chollas Creek to assess the landslide's danger. The house was "yellow-tagged," which means it is uninhabitable until the hillside is stabilized.

The dispatcher said the residents were able to retrieve belongings and pets, and the Red Cross helped them find temporary housing.
