

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING CALIFORNIA CAPITAL AIRSHOW SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

1. Qualified applicants must attend or be admitted to a college or university on a full time basis in the fall, 2011 semester.
2. There are two application types: current or returning college students who will be attending college in fall of 2011; high school seniors scheduled to graduate in winter of 2010 or spring of 2011.
3. Current or returning college students who have at least two years remaining in order to achieve their educational goals must include:
 - Current contact information.
 - All college transcripts, college major, and the student's current or most recent GPA.
 - Letter of reference from a community or business leader who can speak to the applicant's interests and abilities related to science, technology, engineering, math, aviation, aeronautics, or aerospace. This letter must be on company or agency letterhead.
 - Statement from student that addresses the personal career goals, educational goals, and work, military or other experience related to science, technology, engineering, math, aviation, aeronautics or aerospace. The statement should be between 250 and 500 words.
 - Parent or guardian signature if the student is not 18 years old by May 31, 2011.
4. High school seniors are required to provide the following:
 - Current contact information.
 - Parent or guardian signature if the student is not 18 years old by May 31, 2011.
 - Official transcripts must be provided. Grades related to any college courses taken while attending high school must be included in the scholarship application as a separate GPA.
 - Letter of reference from a community or business leader who can speak to the applicant's interests and abilities related to science, technology, engineering, math, aviation, aeronautics or aerospace. This letter must be on company or agency letterhead.
 - Statement from student that addresses the personal career goals, educational goals, and work, military or other experience related to science, technology, engineering, math,

aviation, aeronautics or aerospace. The statement should be between 250 and 500 words.

- School counselor or teacher must review the materials submitted by the student and provide additional comments about the student's interests and abilities related to science, technology, engineering, math, aviation, aeronautics or aerospace.
