

3.6 quake hits Berkeley

BERKELEY -- An earthquake with a magnitude of 3.6 rocked the Bay Area this morning.

The temblor happened at 5:36 a.m. and was centered in Berkeley, according to the U.S. Geological Survey. It had a depth of about 6 miles.

There were no immediate reports of damage.

The quake was the latest shaker in Berkeley along the Hayward Fault over the past week.

Last Thursday, the region shook with a one-two punch in the form of a 4.0 quake and a 3.8 aftershock that were widely felt.
